

New Undergraduate Programmes Starting in September 2019

Christ the Redeemer College is now offering five BA programmes in Theology and Ministry:

BA (Hons) Theology and Ministerial Leadership
BA (Hons) Theology and Ministry with Counselling
BA (Hons) Theology and Ministry with Entrepreneurship
BA (Hons) Theology and Ministry with Media Culture
BA (Hons) Theology and Ministry with Youth Work and Music

Our undergraduate programmes combine academic excellence with opportunities to develop practical ministry skills. You will gain a UK undergraduate degree awarded by Newman University and develop skills for future leadership and ministry roles in churches or other organisations.

Alongside one of the five specialist areas, your programme will also cover theology, biblical studies, leadership, mission and contemporary culture, as well as academic skills such as communication and critical thinking required of higher education in the UK.

Foundation Year

We also offer a foundation year. This is a one-year programme that will ensure you have the foundational skills needed to undertake one of our BA programmes. This programme is particularly suitable for applicants without A-Level qualifications. As part of the admissions process, we will work with you to decide which programme you should start with.

Flexibility to Suit You: Campus-based or Distance Learning, Full-time or Part-time

We offer both campus-based and distance learning programmes, or a combination of the two. Our campus-based programmes are delivered in Harrow, North West London, with teaching taking place for a full-day every Friday during term time. Our distance learning programmes are structured flexibly to fit your availability, but you will need to set aside a regular time for study each week.

All our programmes can be undertaken full-time or part-time. Typically, our full-time undergraduate programmes take three years and part-time, either four and a half years or six years depending upon how many modules you take each year. On a full-time programme you will undertake 120 credits per year (six 20-credit modules) and part-time you will undertake 80 credits per year (four 20-credit modules).

You can start our distance learning programme at any time during the academic year.

Our Facilities

Over the last three years, we have refurbished a Grade II listed property in Harrow, North West London, as our main College Campus. The building comprises several lecture/teaching rooms that are well-equipped with state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment, a modern library with quiet study space, a computer suite and various social spaces with kitchen and refreshment facilities.

The College's physical library space consists of over 2000 books and journals in addition to electronic learning resources which we make available through our Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) which will be an essential part of your learning experience.

Summer term (12 weeks): 17 April to 4 July 2019

Course Fees and Student Finance

The course fee for the College's BA programmes is £6,000 per year. If studying part-time, the fees will be spread over either four-and-a-half or six years depending on how many modules you want to study each year.

For students who are not eligible to receive UK student finance, we offer a range of flexible options for you to pay in instalments.

Entry requirements

- This is a professional programme in theology and Christian ministry: We are looking for a commitment to undertaking Christian ministry in addition to applicants meeting the academic entry requirements.
- 2 A levels, an alternative level 3 qualification or for students aged over 21 there is also the opportunity to apply based on ministry experience and then undertaking our initial student evaluation (ISE).
- English Language ability at GCSE grade C / 5 or above. Applicants who don't have the equivalent of an English Language GCSE (at grade C/5) will need to take the Cambridge English Proficiency Test and achieve a level B2.
- A basic level of proficiency in Information Technology (especially email and word-processing) is expected of all applicants but developing additional IT skills takes place through the College's IT skills training programme.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

Applicants may be eligible for RPL if they have undertaken similar study at another higher education institution and wish to either transfer individual module credits or transfer directly onto the second or third year of the degree programme if they have a CertHE or Foundation Degree/DipHe respectively.
